

THE TWEEDDALE BLEND - stand 7b

The Tweeddale Blend was originally produced by J & A Davidson (established 1820) in Coldstream by the river Tweed in the Scottish Borders and then by my Great Grandfather up until World War 2 when it was last produced. I inherited my Great Grandfather's cellar book containing the "recipes" and established Stonedean Limited in January 2009 with the sole purpose of recreating the blend. The 1st batch was bottled on Monday 24th May this year.

The Tweeddale Blend contains 50% grain and 50% malt whisky; a single grain and 8 malt whiskies (from Lowland, Highland, Speyside and Islay distilleries) bottled at the traditional strength of 46% abv and not chill filtered. Each whisky is drawn from single cask as per the original recipe with youngest whisky being 10 years old but the oldest being 21 years old.

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
